98c Learning Loss Plan

The WWCSD will use 98c funds to mitigate pandemic learning gaps and emotional health concerns through an accelerated learning system that includes a focus on high-quality academics, supportive learning environments, healthy system conditions, and a MTSS system of scaffolded supports. Funds will be allocated to specialized summer enrichment/intervention school programs, training, socio-emotional learning, instructional materials, technology, acceleration and enrichment experiences, STEM and college and career readiness.

The district will also address interrupted learning through allocating funds to support strengthening community partnerships and relationships with parents and families in order to increase communication and access to wrap-around services. These support will include take home instructional materials and support programs for families, summer programming with engaging activities and access to technology to support student learning and engagement. Staff will be supported through job embedded professional development on the acceleration of learning and implementation targeted instructional strategies, career and college readiness and socio-emotional training to meet the needs of all students. Additionally the district will offer summer learning opportunities for staff to learn, work and plan in the areas of multilingual learners, special education, career and college readiness and socio-emotional learning to ensure that all populations of our students are met with strategies and learning opportunities that fit the needs of a Wayne-Westland student.

Funds will be allocated to implement flexible and creative opportunities to support students in the following areas:

- 111: Elementary Services: Instructional Services to Support Learning Loss through enrichment activities.
- 113: High School Services: Registration costs to support enrichment activities
- 125: Compensatory Education: Hands on STEM Materials to support student learning; services to support decreasing absenteeism
- 216: Social Work Services: Mental health supplies to support students across the district
- 219: Summer School: Stipends for staff to support, plan and implement programs in the areas of learning loss, mental health and career/college readiness
- 221: Improvement of Instruction: Supplies for training to support Multilingual learners; professional development connected to ESSER related activities, stipends for staff to meet in PLCs to plan and progress monitor student learning and needs
- 225: Instruction Related Technology: Audio/Visual Technology, Adaptive and Interactive Technology to support learning and student engagement.
