- I. Board Member Recognition Dr. Dignan read some highlights from the resolution prepared by Wayne RESA in honor of Board Member Appreciation Month.
- II. Wayne-Westland Innovative Academy

Dr. Dignan introduced Kente Rosser, Kelley Villa, and Steven Barber to the podium. He mentioned that they have done a tremendous job with the Innovative Academy in the last year and a half.

Kente Rosser, Principal of the Wayne-Westland Innovative Academy (WWIA), mentioned that the program at WWIA was redesigned to meet the needs of all students. WWIA offers flexibility, smaller classroom sizes, quarter semesters, block scheduling, and in-person, virtual or hybrid options.

Kelley Villa, Assistant Principal of WWIA, discussed the Widening Advancement for Youth Program (WAY) introduced this year. The WAY Program offers a non-traditional classroom; students visit the learning lab and earn their credits through project-based learning. WWIA is close to having the first graduate from the WAY Program.

Sebastion Roberts, a researcher (student) at WWIA and enrolled in the WAY Program, expressed that joining the WAY Program helped to lead him down a better path. He shared that he was in and out of foster homes and suffered some educational setbacks. The WAY program gave him self-reliance, opportunities for college field trips, inspiration and motivation. He can now

see that he can have things he had never imagined for his future and has excelled faster in the WAY program.

Naylianna Goike, a student at WWIA, this was her first year at WWIA and it has been extremely helpful. She had never passed all of her classes before attending WWIA. The staff made her feel welcome and made her transition easy.

Steven Barber, Assistant Principal of Virtual Programs, oversees the virtual program for the entire district. WWIA offers entirely virtual or hybrid options, K-5 Virtual Program is synchronous which means that Wayne-Westland teachers meet in a virtual setting with students all day long, 6-12 grades are asynchronous which means that the students set their own schedules and work at their own pace. The virtual program has just over 500 students and continuously growing.

Dr. Dignan thanked the WWIA leadership, staff and students for their powerful testaments.

III. Recognition of Wayne County Sheriff Raphael Washington

Dr. Dignan mentioned that every time the district has called on Sherriff Washington he has always been there. Dr. Dignan thanked him and presented an award of recognition to him.

Sheriff Raphael Washington, Wayne County Sheriff - Appreciated being recognized and said he would be here to help out Wayne-Westland whenever he is needed. He mentioned that he works well with the Westland Police Department and believes they are stronger together and will continue to move Westland forward.

Dr. Dignan thanked Ali Sayed, owner of Hype Athletics, for his community activism. His contributions through Hype Athletics and the Wayne-Westland Foundation Board have been tremendous. He made a generous donation of 10,000 Hype Athletics gift certificates to Wayne-Westland Community Schools for student awards.

Ali Sayed share that he was grateful and mentioned that he shares the same dedication as the district, which is to serve the community. He has no agenda; he enjoys giving back and is honored to be recognized.

Dr. Dignan thanked Mr. Sayed and presented an award of recognition to him.

V. Student Space Experiment Program – Nathan/Bidne

Dr. Dingan shared that Wayne-Westland Community Schools is going to space and introduced Amy Bidne, K-8 STEM Teacher and Adrienne Nathan Director of Community Partnerships and Outreach.

Mrs. Nathan shared that in October they asked for funds to support the Wayne-Westland Student Space Experiment Program, and introduced Ms. Bidne to discuss the opportunities it provided.

Mrs. Bidne thanked everyone for the opportunity to share the information and the staff and students for their hard work. The board members were presented with an example of a project that can be made in the STEM Center. She shared that over 180 students participated in the student space experiment program, 32 proposals were submitted to two different review panels which narrowed the selection down to three finalists, and one of the three was chosen. This program is an authentic project-based learning experience and she is excited that Wayne-Westland students will have their experiments sent into space. The experiment will remain there for six weeks, astronauts will follow the student's experiment instructions and the findings will be returned to the students. The students who were selected to have experiments sent into space will be invited to a national conference to present the findings of the experiment.

Linda Willman, a teacher at John Glenn, was excited to have had students participate in the experiment and two of her classroom students were selected as finalists. She mentioned that one of the scientists on the review panel commented that one of the students had captured an experiment from an angle that they had seen captured before.

Mrs. Bidne noted that tudents from grades 5-12 participated and were so passionate, they would email all hours of the night about the experiment. She recognized all of the students and staff that participated. She mentioned that between now and the lift-off in June that they will be working on the completion of the patch and an art contest which will be displayed at the DIA. Lift-off will be no earlier than June 9th. Once they receive the exact lift-off date they start a community countdown.
