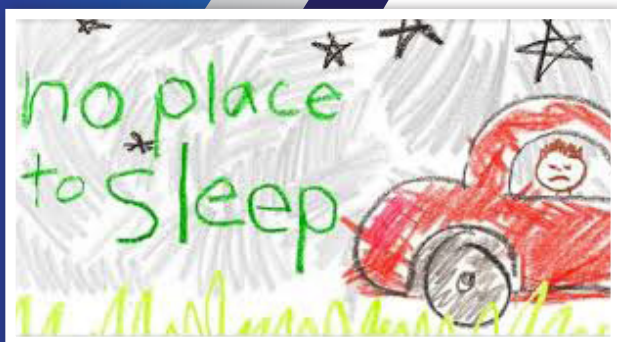


## Are You Homeless?

### **Rights of Students Experiencing Homelessness**

Under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

1. Immediate enrollment in school even when lacking:
  - Proof of residency
  - School records
  - Birth certificate
  - Medical records
2. Free lunch
3. Assistance with transportation
